Isabella Rosner was born April 3—7 pounds, 3.6 ounces, 20 3/4 inches. (Now it's July and she's 12 pounds, 24 1/2 inches.) I'd hoped to get caught up before she came, as it'd be impossible afterward, and actually did finish the March and April issues ahead of time, only to have them stack up in the publication process.

For a long time, you've been receiving multiple issues in a single mailing every two or three months. You pay two bucks for an issue a month. What you get however, are something like five mailings a year, each consisting of two or three issues at around five bucks per mailing. This isn't ideal. So, in the interest of fairness and policing myself, from now until *Noesis* is back on a true monthly basis, I'll renew subscriptions at the rate of \$1.50 per issue. (I'm not taking the number on your mailing label, subtracting the current issue number and multiplying the difference by 4/3, but any dues money sent from now until we're mailing out single issues will be credited at \$1.50 an issue.) You still get credit for submissions at the rate of one issue for every two pages.
