While I do not wish to use this space for private purposes, its being so available, prompts me to present some of my own ideas. I have as you know been doing research with the development and use of my Stress-Fair Compatibility Test. A recent finding being that the political left are distinctly different from the right and consistently defineable profilewise on the test. Factors (8) and (10) added give an accurate picture. F(8) is a measure of Maturity, or advocacy. A low score = Selfishness. A high score a concern for others. F(10) is a measure of Dominance, or forcefulness of will. A high combined score equates with a left wing political stance, a low combined score with the right. It came as quite a surprise to me that something apparently as complex as politics should have so easily a defineable framework. I had previously discovered that Religious belief was characterised as high F(2), (4) and (6) and low F(1), (3) and (5). Absence of Religious belief the opposite. This is of course only a tendency, the sum of the factors being what was decisive - which side one took. The factors were: (1) INTELLECTIVE (Tendency to think things through) (2) EXTRAVERSION (3) SENSITIVITY (4) IDEALISM (5) MOTIVATION (6) AWARENESS (Aware beyond immediate concerns). The other factors in the test for those interested were: (7) GROUP DETACHMENT (8) MATURITY (9) COMPLEXITY (Structural depth of the Personality) (10) DOMINANCE (Forcefulness of will). The sharp delineations have set me wondering just how much of what we count as under our control and as our 'Person' is not simply a set of laws understandable to those who can find them. If the framework I seem to have seen in some small measure is as real as I suspect it of being, then transference of energy within this structure might give us the means of curing disorders of the mind and unlocking much needed self-actualisation?. I just have a feeling about it at this stage.

Recently I was sent a copy of the TNS recruitment brochure. This has suggested a possible lay out for the 606 Society. I would like to get underway with this. I would like to name some of our people and a very brief statement of their AREA of achievement.
